





The first thing you'll notice is that we realize why you come to ExchangeDefender – to manage your secure communications – and we've dedicated most of the screen to the task at hand. The navigation is on the left, shortcuts and controls across the top. The remaining 80% of the interface is dedicated to the content you're working on.


Focus on What Matters Most

Navigation and shortcuts can easily be docked (or hidden) from view. Minimizing distractions allows you to focus on the task at hand. As you become more familiar with the user interface, you'll appreciate the overall functionality. Friendly icons, ease your transition as you hop from one feature to the next; an added plus, they won't take up much of your screen.


Want to hide or show things?

Tiny but Mighty

We realize that not everyone is on the latest 34" widescreen monitors. We also know you have other apps and sometimes you want to keep ExchangeDefender open in the corner. Well, when you start shrinking the width of the ExchangeDefender window, you will see components move around and highlight just the key information instead of all the navigation, design, and shortcuts.

Shortcuts to Frequent Tasks on Every Page

The new interface is extremely responsive and live, no unnecessary clicks or long wait-time for pages to load or refresh. We've also placed several of the frequently changed features on every page, allowing you to quickly adjust while you work. For example, settings are still available as a whole page but you can instantly change SPAM policies, access your trusted devices and other services simply by clicking on the gear icon located in the upper right-hand corner.



More Productivity, Less Tabs

As we roll out the new user interfaces to improve the experience across all of our applications, we will also make it easy to hop from one service to another. Clicking on the deck icon in the upper left-hand corner will give you access to other services so you don't have to login into 5 different web sites or keep multiple windows or tabs that just eat up your resources – so we're making your computer faster too!



Better Transparency & Consistency

The new user interface is a model for the way we'll be unifying the look and feel across all of our applications. Frequently performed tasks will be right at the top, as you'd most likely be coming to the page with just a handful of tasks. We've moved the documentation behind "Helpful Information" dropdown, so that help is available whenever the user needs it and addresses the very specific questions about the window that you're on.

Paging, search, filtering, export, sorting – all of your typical things are there. But as we see the IT security evolving, there are now policies that are mandated by your service provider, management, specific department policy, and so on – we're making it easier to understand why certain actions are available or restricted so that users know exactly why the service behaves the way it does. We've embedded these notifications, statuses, labels, and identifiers right next to the object in question (in this screen you see blacklisted domains that are blocked by the Domain Rule policy, on SPAM quarantines you'll see Released label next to messages that have already been released)
